Ahiena was very glad she could join one of The Leprosy Mission's self-care groups. They have a small plot of land together where they plant, water and tend beans which they can sell. She learnt the importance of washing her hands and feet, and keeping wounds clean. *Give 50p for every tap in your home.*

Maria's eyes are affected by leprosy. She received sunglasses to protect her eyes and reduce the risk of blindness. She has access to the medicines she needs and is glad of the support she receives from her self-care group. *Give 30p for every pair of glasses, or sunglasses in your home.*

Janiero is an artist but has been severely disabled by leprosy. He holds a pen or pencil between his two wrists. He leads a group where he can be himself and makes his own money selling his paintings and drawings. *Give 10p for every art piece you have in your house.*
