If you are taking part in-person, identify two bases in the room – one for 'true' and one for 'false'. Ask the children to run to each base depending on whether they think the answers to the questions are true or false.

If virtual, children can give a thumbs up for 'true' and a thumbs down for 'false'.

ACTIVITY THREE

BIBLE TEACHING PAGE 7

Ask the children to talk about what they think 1 John 4:19 (NIV) means.

Ask the children to look up and read the verses given in the activity and then talk about how they can love others as God has loved them.

Within the prayer time you could prompt the children with the following:

- Give thanks for God's unconditional love
- Pray for God to show us how we can be better at loving one another
- Pray for children in Mozambique, especially those affected by leprosy
- Pray for the work of The Leprosy Mission, and for funds to build Hubs of Hope.

Can you imagine not being able to see a doctor when you're feeling poorly? It's very hard to get medicine in rural Mozambique villages, so even simple problems like diarrhoea can be fatal.

People speak Portuguese in Mozambique



Cassava is the staple food. Boiled/steamed Cassava is usually served with vegetables and at times beef stew.





56% of people can read and write





42% of all children are malnourished







39% of girls and 52% of boys go to school. Girls often have to drop out of school to care for younger siblings or family members who are sick.





Over 70% of schools don't have water, or separate toilets for boys and girls.





53% of girls are married by aged 18



Mozamabique has one of the fastest growing economies in the world however,





64% of people in Mozambique live on less than US\$1.90 a day



MEET TEJUNA

Tejuna is eight years old and she lives with her parents and eight siblings in Mozambique. How many brothers and sisters do you have? Jesus teaches us that we must love one another and that we are all brothers and sisters if we believe in Him. no matter where we live in the world.

Tejuna's dad is called Mecaua. He grows maize, sesame and millet to feed his family. It's often hard to grow crops in Mozambique because of natural disasters like droughts. Tejuna, her dad and also her grandma are affected by leprosy. Thankfully, they were cured by a health volunteer trained by The Leprosy Mission. They just had to take a mixture of antibiotics called Multidrug therapy.

Sadly not everyone knows what leprosy is, or that it can be cured. So The Leprosy Mission joins with communities to teach them about this disease. It's very important to take the antibiotics quickly, otherwise leprosy causes lots of problems including losing feeling in hands and feet.

The Leprosy Mission is working with communities like Tejuna's to build Hubs of Hope. These are special places where people can come together to learn about leprosy and how to stay healthy. Learning is lots of fun and is usually done through traditional songs and dancing. At a Hub of Hope, people like Mecaua also learn how to protect crops and farmland from severe weather caused by climate change.

ACTIVITY TWO

TRUE OR FALSE QUIZ!

What is leprosy?

QUESTION ONE

LEPROSY IS A DISEASE THAT MAKES FINGERS AND TOES FALL OFF.

FALSE – without fast treatment, leprosy causes loss of feeling in hands and feet. If you can't feel pain, it's really easy to injure yourself. Cuts can become infected and cause disability.

QUESTION TWO

LEPROSY CANNOT BE CAUGHT BY TOUCH.

TRUE – you can't catch leprosy by touching someone affected by the disease. This is an important message for people in Mozambique who are often very frightened of leprosy. Many people hide away if they think they have the disease, because they are scared that they will be rejected by their community.

QUESTION THREE

LEPROSY IS COMMON IN COUNTRIES WHERE THERE ARE POOR LIVING CONDITIONS.

TRUE – people who don't have a healthy diet and clean water are more likely to suffer from disease. It is easier to catch leprosy if you do not have a strong and healthy body.

QUESTION FOUR

EVERY TWO MINUTES SOMEONE NEW IS DIAGNOSED WITH LEPROSY.

TRUE – in 2018, over 230,000 people were diagnosed with leprosy around the world. That's one person every two minutes!

QUESTION FIVE

THERE IS NO CURE FOR LEPROSY.

FALSE – it's great news that leprosy can be cured with a mixture of three antibiotics. This is called Multidrug therapy.

ACTIVITY THREE

BIBLE TEACHING

WE LOVE BECAUSE HE FIRST LOVED US.

1 John 4:19 NIV

God is love, He created love and loved us first. He loves us with an unconditional love, no matter what we do or where we go. We are loved!

HOW TO MAKE A HUB OF HOPE


Instructions:


Using the template provided:

- 1. Cut out a rectangle with a small door cut out
- 2. Cut out the circle with a slit up one side (half-way along)
- 3. Colour in the rectangle & circle
- 4. Add fringing (wool/grass/straw) to the roof
- 5. Glue one side of the rectangle to make the walls
- 6. Glue the circle to make a dome shape
- 7. Place the dome on top of the walls and glue together

ACTIVITY FIVE

BAKE A MOZAMBICAN BANANA CAKE!

Bake at home | Prep Time: 20 mins | Cooking Time: 40-45 mins

INGREDIENTS

for the cake:

- Ø 115g Unsalted Butter
- O 180g Caster Sugar
- O 3 Eggs
- O 190g Self Raising Flour
- O 1/2tsp Baking Powder
- O 1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda
- O 3 Ripe Bananas
- O 1/2tsp Ground Nutmeg
- O 1tsp Vanilla Extract
- O 75ml Buttermilk
- O 4tbsp Desiccated Coconut

O50g Chopped Cashew Nuts (optional)

for the icing:

- O 25g Butter
- O 2tbsp Dessicated Coconut
- O 1 Ripe & mashed banana
- O 125g Icing Sugar
- O 1tsp Vanilla Extract

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 180°C.

Lightly grease your 20cm cake tin with butter & dust with flour.

Cream together the butter ϑ sugar until fluffy, add eggs one at a time until incorporated well.

Sift together the flour, baking powder, nutmeg & bicarbonate of soda.

Then fold into the butter mixture with coconut & cashews.

Mash the bananas and fold into the batter.

Mix the buttermilk and vanilla extract then add into the batter.

Spoon into your tin and bake on the middle shelf of the oven.

Bake for 40-45 mins – then remove from oven to cool for 10 mins, before transferring to a wire rack.

And finally, the icing

Mix the butter and icing sugar until they cream together.

Add in vanilla essence, bananas and coconut then mix well into a smooth paste.

Gently add spoonfuls on top of the cooled cake and using a palette type knife smooth across the cake.
